Internet Sales Tax Bill DIES

Lt. Governor Tate Reeves decided to let House Bill 480 die in committee on Tuesday's deadline day. He called the bill unconstitutional, saying it would violate a Supreme Court ruling from about two decades ago. HB 480 would have required online companies that do not have a presence in Mississippi to begin collecting and remitting sales back to the state. The bill also earmarked the new revenue collected for infrastructure (70% for MDOT; 15% for Cities; 15% for Counties).

(Calls Needed) \$50 Million for Local Bridge Repair!

MAS Proposal Item Moves Through the Process: Efficiency in Purchasing

On Tuesday, <u>Senate Bill 2836</u> passed the House County Affairs Committee. This measure raises the purchasing threshold from \$1,000 to \$1,500 for purchases that would **not** require a purchase requisition form.
